Forfeiture of Scholarship Award: If a student that has been awarded a scholarship by the Sophisticated Gents has not enrolled in school by September 15, 2022, the money will be considered forfeited by the student. The forfeited amount will be returned to the scholarship fund. This rule shall be waived if the student shows proof that they were ill and contacts us during the enrollment period. Also, if the student elects to miss the first semester of the next school year and wants to attend the second semester instead, the scholarship committee will make the decision about that award on an individual basis.

Within the positions I have worked in before, I have maintained communication paths through phones, emails, and in person assistance. I am looking toward to becoming an assistant who specializes in OB/GYN. I strive to be a leader in any place they put me. I also have an interest in the rights of minorities and diversity, as shown by my certification in SAFEzone training done in 2019. I will incorporate that in my future in the medical field. I have an interest in in the medical field, which shows that I can assist others and be able to identify complex problems and come up with proper paths to solutions. I pay most of my bills on my own due to not having financial assistance from my parents. I actually cannot afford classes for the Summer and Fall due to diminishing benefits from the government PELL grant. I am grateful that you thought of me!

2. Andrew Jenkins:

Upon entering the 2022-2023 school year, I will still be attending UCF and majoring in Psychology, specifically on the Clinical Track. I am still in need of financial assistance this upcoming school year due to the impact COVID-19 has had on my family and an increase in the number of people my parents are financially supporting. As a result of the job loss that occurred due to COVID-19, my expected family contribution has dropped over fifty percent for this upcoming school year. Another factor that contributed to this drop is there are now two additional family members in my household that are financially dependent on my parents. One of my family members who is now living with us is being treated for deteriorating cognitive function, which is currently believed to be the onset of dementia, and my parents are paying all the medical bills for their testing. Furthermore, my younger brother will also be attending college in the 2022-2023 school year, which my parents will be also contributing to. Receiving financial assistance will allow me to focus on my education as much as possible so I can maintain a high GPA, which will hopefully allow me to enter graduate school.

- 3. Provide a copy of 2021 Fall Semester or Quarter schedule of classes.
- **4.** Write a short paragraph explaining a need for continued financial support for your education.

The above requirements must be completed by August 30, 2022. If a student that has been awarded a multi-year scholarship by the Sophisticated Gents has not enrolled back in school by August 30, 2022, that money will be considered forfeited by the student and returned to the general scholarship fund. Extenuating circumstances request by a student will be reviewed by the Scholarship Committee.
